

Nursery Home Challenges Week 4

Hello Nursery! Here are some more challenges to keep you busy.

<p>Find yourself a teddy or special toy to read to. Get one of your story books and make up your own story using the pictures. Make sure you tell your teddy who the characters are.</p>	<p>Write the numbers 0 to 5 or 0-10 on post it notes or small pieces of paper and hide them around the rooms in your house/flat or in the garden. Ask your child to find the numbers and tell you the name of the number they have found.</p>	<p>I hear with my little ear This game is perfect for journeys, either car, train or airports. Much like the 'I spy' favourite this is much simpler and loads of fun. Great for kids as soon as they can speak. You say "I hear with my little ear - something that sound like Oink" We have had hours of fun playing this in traffic jams.</p>	<p>Make a paper aeroplane and see how far it can fly.</p>	<p>Play "Where's My Teddy?". Ask a grown up or older sibling to hide a teddy bear in the house for you to find. They will help you to find where the teddy is hidden by singing a nursery rhyme. When you get closer to the teddy they need to sing more loudly. When you get further away from the teddy they need to sing more quietly</p>
<p>Make a collage by tearing and sticking old newspapers, magazines, catalogues or any craft materials you have at home. Don't use scissors!</p>	<p>Watch Numberblocks on CBeebies. Can you make one of the characters using boxes?</p>	<p>Look in the cupboard for three different sized tins or packets. Feel them. Are they heavy or light? Can you work out which is the heaviest? Which is the lightest? Can you put them in order?</p>	<p>Keep trying to do up your own coat.</p>	<p>Make an indoor obstacle course. You could use cushions, pillows, bean bags or hula hoops, or even bounce on the bed or the sofa!!</p>
<p>Find two objects in your house that rhyme e.g. a sock and a clock!</p>	<p>Listen to some music and show off your best dance moves</p>	<p>Draw around your hand and turn it into a monster!</p>	<p>Speak to a family member on the phone and ask them about their day</p>	<p>Wash the windows. Look out of the window what can you see? Can you keep a tally chart?</p>
