- We want all children to have outstanding behaviour, to be confident and polite communicators and to work within an ethos of mutual respect, both within the Ellingham community and the wider community.
- We want all children to be confident to step outside their comfort zone, to have a go, and take a risk, and to understand that we learn from making mistakes.
- We want all children to have an outstanding understanding of how to keep themselves and others safe and healthy, both in mind and body, and to put this into practice on a daily basis.
- We want all children to have high aspirations and to understand how the things that they learn at Ellingham will help them in the near and more distant future.
- We want all children to love coming to Ellingham, to feel happy and secure and to have a sense of achievement at the end of every day.
